Registration

All new students of the University must complete online registration. If you do not have British or Irish nationality, you must also complete physical registration in person when you arrive onto campus.

Typically, we will require you to complete registration within four weeks of the programme start date for postgraduate students (with exceptions for certain groups of students). Once you have accepted your offer and all offer conditions have been met, we will provide you with further instructions and guidance in relation to the registration process via the [Applicant Portal](#).

Please note that if you fail to complete registration or provide any reasonably required information (including valid ID documentation and required criminal conviction data) by the specified deadline, we may withdraw your offer.

Important Information for All Applicants

The University must comply with all aspects of the Immigration Rules and sponsor guidance, and support immigration control. We must take steps to ensure that every student at the University who is subject to immigration control has permission to study in the UK throughout the whole period of their study. You are required to provide proof of your permission to study in the UK at the point of registration. The type of proof you require will be dependent on your nationality and immigration status, and may include:

- **If you are a British national or Irish national:** a British or Irish passport in your name (or an Irish passport card), or a birth or adoption certificate issued in the UK together with proof of your permanent National Insurance number.
- **If you are not a British national or Irish national, but you have permanent permission to live in the UK:** an immigration status document confirming your indefinite permission to remain in the UK, or a copy of your online eVisa confirming your permanent permission to remain in the UK.
- **If you are not a British national or Irish national, and you have temporary permission to live in the UK:** an immigration status document confirming your temporary immigration status, or a copy of your online eVisa confirming your temporary permission to remain in the UK.

This is not an exhaustive list and the appropriate proof of your right to study may be different to the above.

Important Information for International Students

If you require a Student visa to study in the UK, you will need to ensure you have the following before you make your visa application:

1. The original documents used to obtain your offer (including proof of English language competency);

3. A valid Confirmation of Acceptance to Study (CAS) number issued by the University. The CAS is a virtual document that confirms that the University is willing to act as your educational sponsor.
